Research and Interpretation Volunteer

What is the project?

Would you like to know more about the fashions, passions and influences of those who lived at Temple Newsam house? Join us as a volunteer and use their possessions and archive records to reveal stories about their lives. We are hoping to explore interesting and previously untold stories that connect the permanent arts collection at the house with past inhabitants.

Volunteers will work closely with the Assistant and Community Curators to investigate local archives and primary sources. These will be used to help develop the reinterpretation of the house, making our collections and stories accessible and appealing to diverse audiences.

What's in it for you?

Gain experience of research and interpretation for a country house.

Work with one of the finest publicly owned fine and decorative arts collections in the country Utilise your own skills and talents

Learn new skills –training will be given in all aspects of the role Be part of a friendly team

What's involved?

Research the people and collections at Temple Newsam House Investigate and transcribe archival material at West Yorkshire Archive Service Attend induction meetings and relevant training Be involved in shaping the way the collection is presented to visitors

The role will suit people who are enthusiastic and reliable. You will have good research skills and an eye for detail. Ideally you will have an interest in art or history. You should enjoy working as a team and be keen to learn from and share ideas with others. You should be able to work both with and without supervision when required. All volunteers should be willing to abide by the Council's code of conduct. No qualifications are required as training where necessary will be given.

We welcome applications from a range of backgrounds. If you are shortlisted, please tell us if you require any adjustments to be made to enable you to attend.

Expenses: Out of pocket travel costs between home and your volunteering place will be paid up to the value of £6.00 per day.
